

Fürth Perinatal Centre – High-tech with a heart

A birth is always a joyous occasion – a new person is coming into the world.

However, sometimes a pregnancy does not go as the parents-to-be hope it will. Problems can occur for both the mother and the unborn child, which can lead to premature labour and possibly even a premature birth.

Our team of experienced midwives, nursing staff and doctors are available at all times before, during and after delivery. Our primary and most important goal is always to prevent a premature birth.

However, if it isn't possible to stop a birth, the premature baby receives the highest level of care, in which the necessary high-tech medicine is used and at the same time emotional needs are taken into account in medical considerations and decisions. In our Perinatal Centre, we practise high-tech with a heart!

In our Women's Clinic, you will be cared for by our senior physicians who specialise in complications during pregnancy and birth (perinatologists).

Very small premature babies are cared for in the Paediatric Clinic by specially trained and experienced senior physicians (neonatologists).

Before the birth

- Birth registration (online or in person in the delivery room)
- Parents' information evening

Women's Clinic

- Introduction for birth in the event of a high risk pregnancy in our outpatient consultation hours (in the medical care centre, right next to the delivery room.)
 - Maternal illnesses
 (high blood pressure, diabetes, gestational diabetes, etc.)
 - Pre-eclampsia
 - Advice on breech births, e.g. external turning, spontaneous delivery, caesarean section
 - Multiple births
 - Childhood growth disorders, childhood abnormalities

During the birth

- Five delivery rooms
- C-section surgery in the delivery room
- Water births
- Additional care from midwifery students
- Spontaneous delivery for breech babies and twins

After the birth

- Family rooms
- Breastfeeding advice by professionally trained breastfeeding con sultants (IBCLC)
- U2 medical check-up by a paediatric specialist
- Ultrasound if required

We also care for premature babies and newborns in our P1 intensive care unit at the Paediatric Clinic. Due to the close proximity to the



obstetrics department, our team can look after your premature or newborn baby immediately and, if necessary, take them to our ward. If your child no longer requires intensive care, we will endeavour to move him or her closer to you.

There are 6 intensive care units available for premature and newborn babies, which are equipped with ventilation or respiratory support. We will care for your child according to development-promoting aspects and basal stimulation. We avoid unnecessary exposure to noise and light and make sure your child gets enough rest. As a parent, you can visit your premature or newborn baby at any time.
